

THE REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Greetings from the heart of legislative activity in Arizona! As the Arizona legislature continues the session, your **ROC** is engaged in crucial matters. Our primary focus remains on A.R.S. § 41-3024.04, commonly known as the "sunset" statute, which sets the termination date for the ROC on July 1st, 2024, unless continued. Additionally, statutes in Title 32, Chapter 10, are slated for repeal on January 1st, 2025. These legislative processes are part of the regular oversight undergone by all state agencies every decade, with our last review conducted in 2014.

Currently, significant strides have been made. Our agency has undergone a thorough self-audit, and we've successfully filed HB 2091 for the continuation of our agency and statutes, with sincere appreciation to our bill sponsor Rep. Laurin Hendrix - D14.



The House Commerce Committee has recommended an 8-year extension. while the Senate Government Committee suggests a 2-year continuation. Our continuation bill HB2091 has successfully navigated through both chambers, receiving full support from the House of Representatives. Currently, it awaits further action in the Senate. We're actively in touch with our sponsor. Representative Hendrix, and are eagerly anticipating further action in the Senate. Stay tuned for more updates as we move forward. Thank you for standing by us and being an integral part of our journey!

<u>Enforcement Action:</u> 7 Warning letters issued to unlicensed entities for advertising without a license.




April 2024

Licensed Complaint Heat Map




